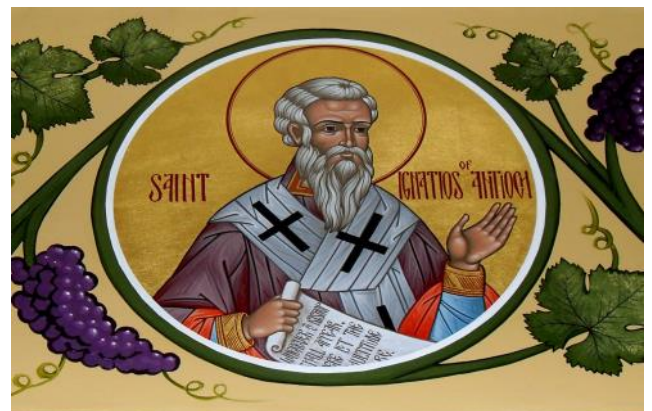

DEACON LUCIO'S HOMILY HOMEWORK



It's okay to take a break sometimes!

In this weekend's gospel, the apostles have just returned from their first *missionary journey*, sent by Jesus to get some practice in preaching and healing. It must have gone pretty well as they came back excited and perhaps a little exhausted. Jesus in His usual caring manner invites them to *come away and rest awhile*. Yet, they are barely able to do that and must forgo their rest as a crowd descends upon them. Jesus, moved with compassion and care, responds to the needs of those people, just as a shepherd would respond to any lost sheep.

In this gospel account, Jesus is setting two examples for us: His invitation to come away and rest; and His tender response to the crowds who have sought Him out. Caring for the needs of others can be exhausting. Even Jesus, the gospels tell us, went away to quiet places for some solitude and prayer with His Father. Here is where Jesus found the strength and renewed energy to meet the crowds that sought Him out for healing, forgiveness, and hope. We too will soon run on empty if we don't take that time for prayer and recharging.

It is a balancing act sometimes of knowing when to attend to our own needs and when to care for others. It can happen that when we are most tired physically and spiritually, a phone call comes, a request for help is made, and we must take a deep breath and respond as best as we are able. But we can't make a pattern of neglecting care for ourselves.

In my years of work at Catholic Charities, we would often address the need for self-care in order to effectively care for others. And this is not being selfish. We spoke about the reality of compassion fatigue and its effects on our work. The fact is that we can't be truly self-giving if we don't have a healthy self left to give, which is what will happen if we don't recharge, or better, make time for prayer where the Lord can recharge us. We all know, whether we have an electric car or cell phone, the battery at some point must be recharged or else! The same is true for our souls! So, for your homily homework this week, ponder these questions and action suggestions...

- How well do I maintain a balance between serving the needs of others and taking the necessary time for rest and prayer?
- What happens to me when the balance is not met? How can being overextended do harm to myself and make me less effective in caring for the needs of others?
- If I struggle with developing a healthy balance between activity and rest or between service and prayer, find a spiritual director or someone to meet with and talk to about this challenge.
- Find a place and space free of distractions and interruptions where you can truly recognize and be more attentive to Jesus' voice.
- Determine to respond to the next person who calls in need, despite any possible inconvenience.

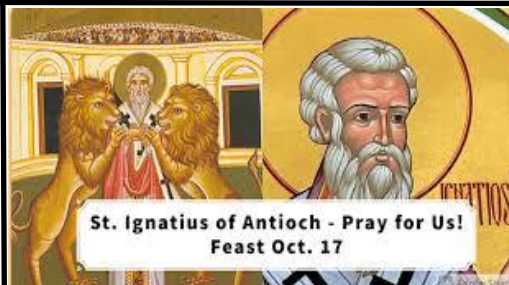
